

IHAP Introduction to Healthcare Employment and Apprenticeships Program



START YOUR NEW HEALTHCARE CAREER

This two-part employment program trains entry-level job seekers for a career in healthcare. Classes are taught online, giving you the flexibility to learn from wherever you have internet access.

Phase 1: Healthcare Foundations (3 weeks)

Explore healthcare careers and develop relevant job skills

Phase 2: NA-C training program (6 weeks + testing)

- Prerequisite: Pass Phase 1 to qualify for Phase 2
- Complete online classes and a hands-on training
- Pass the Washington State written and skills assessments and register as a Certified NA-C.

Phase 1: Healthcare Foundations

Participants in the Phase 1 winter and Phase 2 spring trainings must reside in King County. Not sure which county you live in? Get in touch with us at the contact information below.

Eligibility

- Must be at least 18 years old
- Must be low income
- Able to work in the U.S. without sponsorship
- Pass a background check
- Have a high school diploma or GED,
- Be proficient in English (ESL Level 5) and have basic computer skills.

Phase 2: NA-C Training Program

Eligibility

- Requirements listed for Phase 1
- Immunizations
 - Covid (2 shots) and booster if possible*
 - 3 Series Hep B (Hepatitis B) plus blood draw Titer
 - 2 Series MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella)
 - 2 Series Varicella (Chicken Pox)
 - 2 Series Tdap (Tetanus/Diphtheria/Pertussis)
 - Seasonal Flu Shot
 - TB (Tuberculosis)

2024 Spring Dates

- Enrollment Period: Mar 18 - April 5
- Course Length: April 15 - May 31
